





What is Good Standing?

At Williams Primary School we encourage students to develop the knowledge, skills and values to become productive members of the community. Our Good Standing Policy is one of the ways that we encourage students to consistently demonstrate the values of our **Respect, Responsibility, Initiative, Self-Control** and **Emotional Intelligence (RRISE)** Program. Our policy encourages students to become active participants in developing the culture of the school and assists them to take responsibility for their behaviour and learning.

At stages through the year students who maintain Good Standing will be eligible to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities such as;

- Whole School Events eg: Discos, **RRISE** Celebrations
- Class Rewards
- Incursions
- Excursions
- Camps and Overnight Events
- Faction and Interschool Sporting Events
- Student Leadership Excursions
- Student Leadership Meetings

Maintaining Good Standing

All students begin the year with Good Standing. It is the responsibility of individual students to maintain their Good Standing throughout the year.

To maintain Good Standing students must meet the following standards:

- Follow the values that are articulated in the Williams Primary School **RRISE** Program
- Comply with directions of all staff members
- Follow School Rules in the Classroom and Playground

Loss of Good Standing

A student's Good Standing may be withdrawn at the discretion of the Principal or Deputy Principal in the following circumstances:

- Involvement in any class or playground behaviour where a student is withdrawn from the activity on three separate occasions over a five week period such as:
 - Sent to Buddy Class during instruction time
 - Playground Time Out for behaviours such as: Rough Play, Disrespecting Property, Swearing, Breaching School Rules, Repeated Misbehaviours
 - Referral to Administration for intervention due to behaviour in the class or playground
- Inappropriate behaviour whilst participating in extra-curricular activities such as excursions, sporting events and other onsite or offsite activities.
- A single severe behaviour such as: Fighting, Instigating a Fight, By Standing during a fight, Vandalism or Misuse of the Internet.

Consequences of losing Good Standing

If a student loses Good Standing status they will no longer be eligible to participate in extra curricula activities until their Good Standing status has been reinstated.

Returning to Good Standing

Good Standing will be reinstated when a student is able to maintain the standards listed above for a period of five consecutive weeks. During this time period a student may not attend any extra curricula activities organised by the school.
