

# WILLIAMS PRIMARY SCHOOL

## HOMEWORK GUIDELINES





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Homework is intended to benefit complement classroom learning, foster good study habits and provide an opportunity for students to be responsible for their own learning.

#### **PURPOSE:**

- To support and extend classroom learning.
- To develop positive study habits.
- To develop a responsibility for self-learning.
- To continue the involvement of parents in their child's education, linking home to school.

#### **GUIDELINES:**

- 1. Parents are requested to notify the classroom teacher when homework cannot be completed or complete a homework withdrawal form if they do not want their child to be assigned homework.
- 2. A homework book or 'signer' is recommended for effective planning and school/home communication.
  - Students will utilise a signer/tracker appropriate to the task e.g. Reading book signer, homework folder, sight word list signer, diary or journal.
- 3. Homework set will clearly indicate to both students and parents the due date for assignments.
- 4. Homework consists of consolidation tasks with a literacy/numeracy focus to encourage routines to be built around family and social commitments.
- 5. Homework should match the child's ability and be related to class work.
- 6. Homework may consist of:
  - nightly reading activities to, with and by parents.(Early/Middle Years)
  - simple consolidation/extension tasks associated with classwork.
  - gathering of additional information or materials
  - review of classwork, open-ended tasks and challenges, projects and assignments, essays and research.
  - tasks that are intended not to exceed 30 minutes daily and are usually only set on weeknights. (Early/Middle Years)
  - tasks that are intended not to exceed 45 minutes per weekday and may occasionally include weekends. (Middle/Upper Years)
- 7. Parents should assist students in developing homework schedules and provide regular support and feedback as needed.
- 8. Regular parent/teacher communication is encouraged to ensure homework is at a suitable complexity and support is provided when necessary.

#### **REVIEW:**

This Policy is to be reviewed on an annual basis and has been endorsement by the Williams PS School Council.

#### **Parents** can support student learning by:

- developing a positive and productive approach to homework
- ensuring there is a balance between the time spent on homework and recreational activities
- reading to their child, talking with them and involving them in learning opportunities during everyday household routines and physical activity
- assisting with allocating and reinforcing a scheduled time for homework.
- providing a suitable space to limit distractions.
- maintaining resources required pencils, pens, scissors ...
- discussing the homework requirements with their child.
- · check and signing the Communication Diary.
- linking homework and other learning activities to the families' culture, history and language, linking with relevant services, clubs, associations and community groups.
- discussing homework with their child in their first language, if English is not the main language spoken at home, and linking it to previous experiences
- praising, encouraging and providing assistance as required.
- Insisting on and supporting an appropriate level of independence and responsibility while homework is being completed.
- resisting taking responsibility for homework tasks.
- Communicating with the class teacher should concerns arise.
- attending the school events, productions or displays their child is involved in
